Suggested reading is provided for those who would like to learn more prior to the pilgrimage. Days also include ample opportunity to enjoy the local cuisine, sample the wines and savor the beauty of Italian landscape, art and culture.

Pilgrims stay in the beautiful and comfortable Convent of San Lodovico. Perched on the edge of the medieval hill top city of Orvieto it offers gorgeous views of the valley. A jewel of Italy, Orvieto is graced with one of its finest Cathedrals and is home to many fine artisans and Orvieto Classico wine.

The fee of \$2,500 for single room accommodation (or \$2,200 shared room accommodation) includes all land travel in Italy, entrance fees, room with private bath in the Convent of San Lodovico and two meals daily at the convent. Pilgrims are responsible for making their own flight arrangements to and from Rome's Fiumicino Airport. They will be transported from Fiumicino to Orvieto at a designated time on Monday morning, June 20, and from Orvieto to Fiumicino on Thursday, June 30. 
About our leaders
